Howden's motion to determine the law applicable to the tort claims is granted to the extent that the Court has determined the applicable law. The Court finds, under the "most

significant relationship" test, the factors weigh in favor of applying Florida law and that this will be the law that applies to Counts III, IV and VI in this case.
